









A little splash to cool down in the hot summer sun.



From dissecting chicken legs to explore muscle and tendon structure, to observing vibrant colour changes in metal salt solutions with Bunsen burners, the group was fully engaged in scientific discovery. They even had a hair-raising experience with Van de Graaff generators—literally!
