Write your answers here then try to do your activity with your family or friends. Maybe you could write down how it makes you feel when you are a part of a Team? 😊

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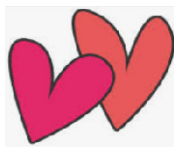
Our Key Stage 5 students also found out which animals need to work together as a team in their everyday life to survive.
