We are very proud of our unique curriculum; we have had excellent support from the local authority to create brand new schemes of work in each subject and those new plans along with our pathways, will be published online by the end of this term. This builds on the hard work from last year; I am really impressed by our teachers who have all willingly taken one (or two!) subject areas each and created whole school plans. We have still grouped the children into informal, semi-formal and formal learners, in line with many special schools, following the Rochford recommendations. We are finding that this better meets the needs of each student and allows them more meaningful social opportunities within a peer group.

We are so looking forward to seeing you all in person one day, when the current crisis is over but as ever thank you to all our parents, staff and most of all the children for your support in making our school the best it can be!
