The Tuck shop team worked hard to create some mouth-watering delights to sell this week. They look very professional in their aprons and gloves, don't you think? Keep up the good work!









It will be organised along the same lines as in previous years, providing 6 free children's tickets and 3 free adult tickets per school.


- 1) For children who wish to participate, please let the school office know. Names will then be entered into a hat and three will be chosen at random.
