Our governors are a very supportive team and have been supporting us, in person all through the term. One such event was our 70th birthday celebrations on 10th December. Sadly, we had to scale down our plans due to Covid. However, driven by the Home School Association's Chair and committee, with support from governors, parents and staff we were able to put on a smaller event for the pupils. It was very important for us to mark the occasion and I am eternally grateful to every single person who contributed their time, their expertise, donated or gave us a prize to help us raise funds. Thanks to the excellent work of Jenna Kendall (ATA in charge of Learning Outside the Classroom), this has been a huge success for the pupils and their parents. We will eventually expand to hosting 8 children at any one time.

This term we look forward to Spring and to new beginnings. The flowers usually start to appear on the driveway at the end of January and everything starts to blossom in our beautiful grounds.

We hope that we can all stay well and keep going through the next term without too much in the way of Covid disruption!
