Even after Mr Brunyee's retirement Steven would pop into school on a weekly basis to check we were all ok and happy.

Steven also provided many hours of entertainment at the annual garden party, being the host with the most! Using his sound system to play his beloved music to the crowds, and calling the raffle at the end of the day.

Steven was a true gentleman and cared for the people of Welburn so much.
