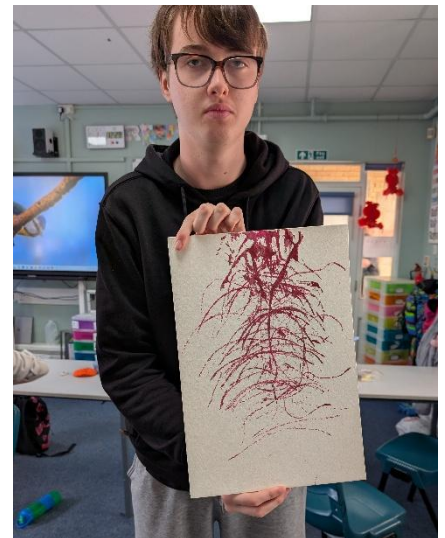
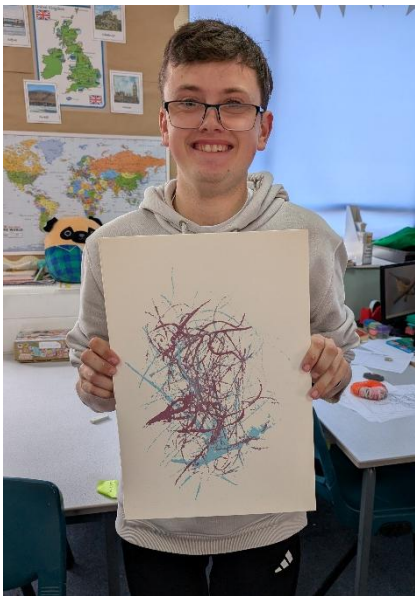

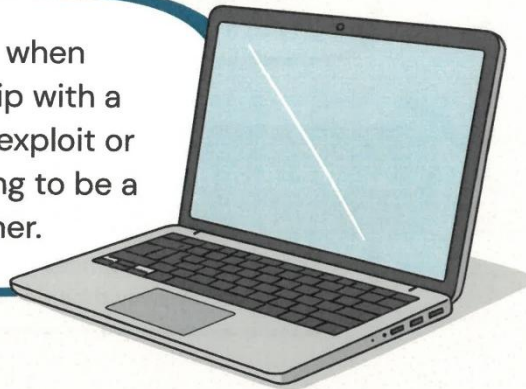

RECOGNISING GROOMING AND ONLINE EXPLOITATION



Online grooming happens when someone builds a relationship with a young person to manipulate, exploit or abuse them – often pretending to be a friend or romantic partner.



Groomers may:

- ▶ Pretend to be someone the same age
- ▶ Offer gifts, money or attention
- ▶ Ask for private photos or videos
- ▶ Try to move the conversation to a private space
- ▶ Encourage the young person to keep secrets

Signs a child is being groomed online

- Becoming secretive about online activity
- Spending more time alone online
- Receiving money or gifts from unknown sources
- Suddenly having new friends or contacts
- Upset, anxious or defensive when asked about online behaviour
