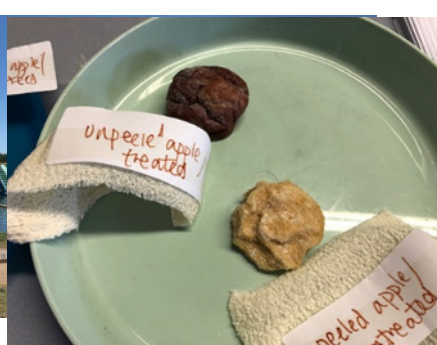
Hello everyone. We've all had another very busy week, take a look at what we have been up to

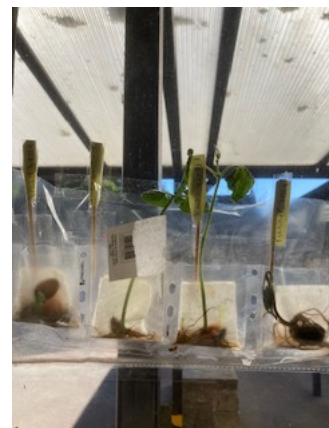
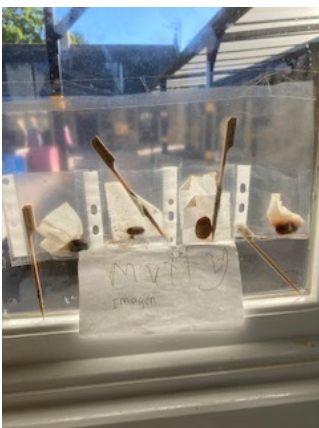
Lower Semi formal class enjoyed Maths outside investigating volume and capacity.

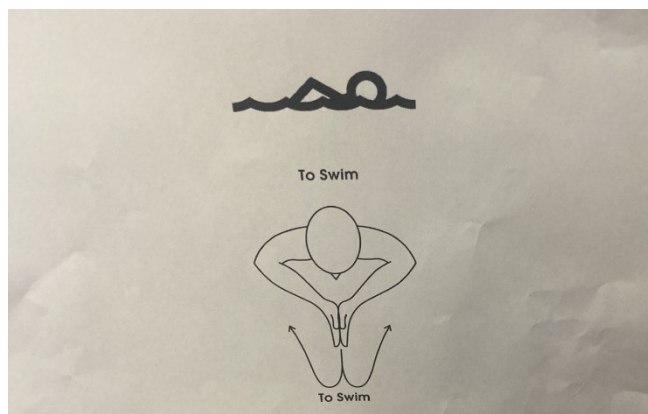
