Pre-Formal class had a fabulous time in their sensory food session this week.


They decorated biscuits ready for today's Children in Need. The tuff tray was filled with a selection of biscuits, sweets, rice paper decorations, sugar and icing.

Introducing

Change Direction

Change Direction, part of North Yorkshire Youth, is a prevention/early intervention support scheme for young people aged 10-17, who may be committing antisocial behaviour, with the intention of diverting them away from the Criminal Justice System.

A Change Direction Keyworker provides nurture and support, to help address any underlying causes of future criminal behaviour. The scheme is trauma-informed and features wide-ranging methods of intervention; led by the interests of the young person. The scheme is goal orientated, with achievable outcomes, dependent on the young person's needs. The young person's involvement with Change Direction is on a voluntary basis.

Key components of Change Direction include:

- An initial assessment of needs and strengths and the production of a tailored support plan
- The offer of one-to-one and group work
- Practical/emotional trauma-informed support where required
- Advocacy to access specialist services
- The delivery of in-house interventions
- Referral to existing commissioned services and other specialist services
- Planned exit with an offer of peer support
- Measurement of progress against identified needs

Community Outreach

Driven by local intelligence and informed by key local issues, the Change Direction scheme includes a community outreach programme to encourage engagement from young people within their community.

Community outreach has a particular focus on identifying young people from hard-to-reach groups or communities, for example from BAME or socially isolated rural communities across North Yorkshire and the City of York.

Referrals are welcome from a range of agencies, including schools/education settings, Community Safety Hubs and North Yorkshire Police.

Other services from North Yorkshire Youth include:

- Buddy Network
- Free training for young people and volunteers
- Youth Directories A-Z of clubs and projects for young people in areas around North Yorkshire.
