He was ably assisted in the task by some of our college students who raked the grass cuttings and deposited them on the compost heap. Great work!










Last week, the event that many of our college students worked so hard to raise funds for, finally happened. It was their week away at the brilliant Peat Rigg Outdoor Training Centre.

"can I go again next year?"








Activities included a river walk, abseiling, zip lining, canoeing, orienteering, bushcraft, team swing, tree climbing, archery and so much more!
