Lower Semi-Formal Adventurers


Our chill out shed is ready with all the fantastic rainforest art we have created. Our students are loving using this space to spend calm time with a friend.

We have made a 4 layered cake to represent the layers of the rain forest. We added eyes for all the animals in the forest.




















Upper Formal 4


College News
