Formal KS5 students have organised an Easter Egg Raffle to raise money for their summer trip!


The raffle will be held on Friday 22 March It's £1 for a strip of 5 tickets

Autism and Specific Learning Needs Update From Rebecca Sealy, Senco

As you'll be aware, our staff attend regular professional development sessions. So far this year we have received additional training in:

- Autism Awareness and Pathological Demand Avoidance
- Zones of Regulation
- Communication Friendly classrooms [with the Speech and Language Team]
- Dyslexia screening
- Visual Supports [with the Speech and Language Team]
- Total Communication [with the Speech and Language Team]
- Colourful Semantics [with the Speech and Language Team].

Next term's training covers different areas of sensory need, provided by the Occupational Therapist and Lego Therapy.

In May there'll be a coffee morning for parents/carers of diagnosed and undiagnosed ASD teenagers and a workshop of ASD overwhelm, meltdown and shutdown. See our April newsletters for more detail.


HSA Quiz Night - the results are in...
