The workshops are aptly titled *Bin There, Drum That* and will continue for another five weeks.

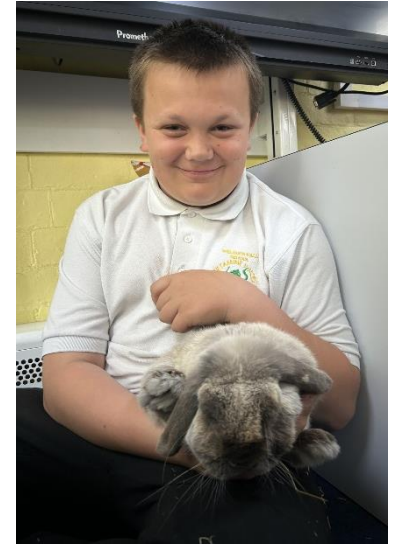


In the end they will create their very own song!

Some of our students created flowers that were used to decorate Nunnington Hall; it was lovely to see them in situ.



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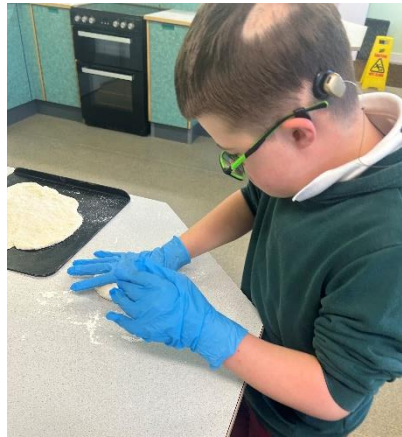

Carers and professionals are invited to a learning workshop with Autism Central to gain understanding of how stress and anxiety can impact neurodivergent people.

The workshop will support with understanding why stress and anxiety for children and young people with an ASD profile or diagnosis may result in burnout, meltdowns and shutdowns and outline ideas to help.

Daisy Chain was initially launched in 2003 as a community initiative offering support to autistic children and young people. Based on a 5.5-acre site and with state-of-the-art facilities, the Daisy Chain day centre is the hub for their many activities, such as social/holiday clubs, family support, sensory suite, placements for young people, wellbeing services, independent living skills, employability and animal therapy.

They also provide community outreach services across the North East.

Since its inception Daisy Chain has evolved significantly and now supports neurodiverse adults as well.

Daisy Chain's specialist trainers will be leading our forthcoming workshop for parents and carers. Daisy Chain is the North East Regional Leader for The Autism Education Trust, which is supported by the Department for Education.

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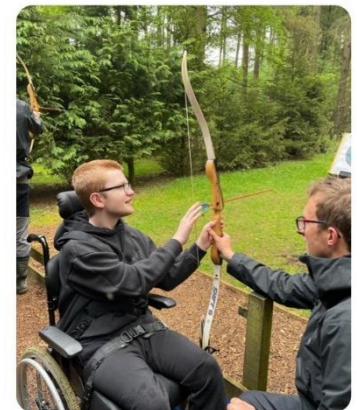


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College Semi Formal Explorers and Pre-Formal Collage had a day trip to Peat Rigg.
