The school bus is on the road taking the kids to school, going 20mph because that's the speed limit.

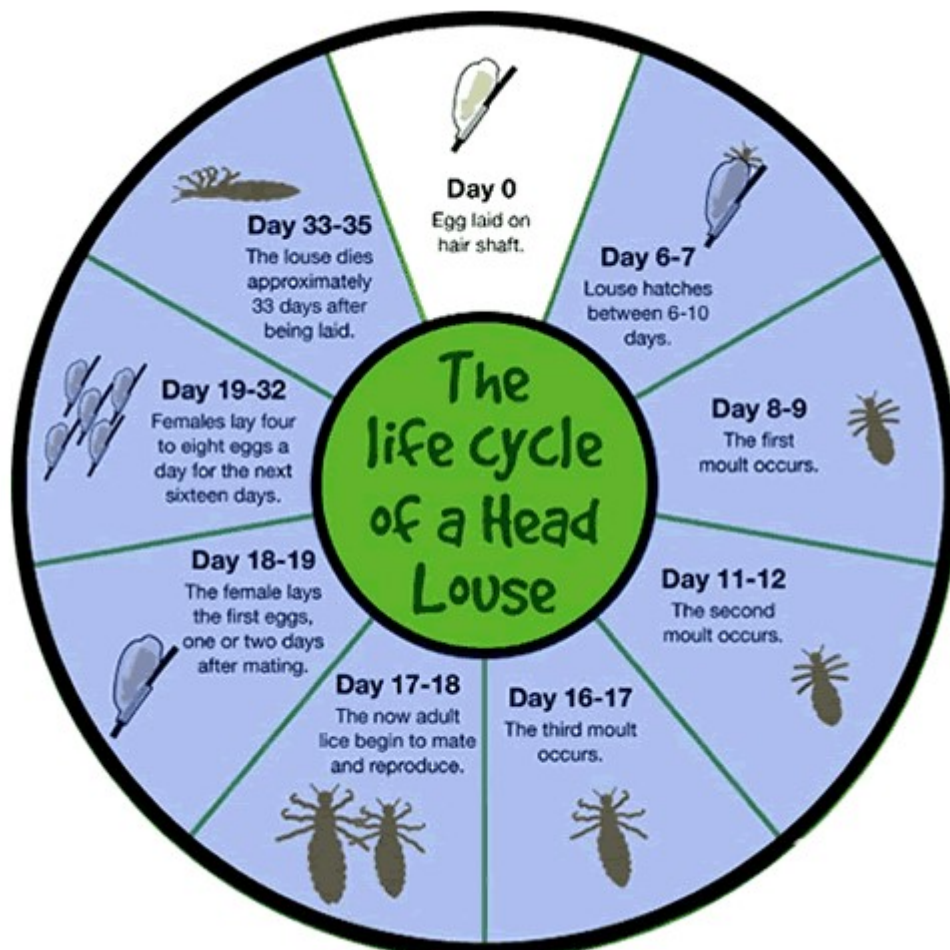
Nathen is on his phone but doesn't realize he is in the middle of the road.
